Course Description	Intermediate Korean B is designed for students who have completed Intermediate Korean A or have the equivalent proficiency. Intermediate Korean B (Fall) will (1) review summer quarter (lesson 7-9), (2) cover the last 5 lessons (lesson 10-14) in the textbook and study (3) related grammar patterns with supplemental materials.

Week	Lesson
Week 1 Review	Review (L7-L9)
Week 2 Lesson 10	Grammar: ~(으)ㄹ 거예요 The pattern ~(으)ㄹ 거예요 is added to verb or adjective stems to express future event
Week 3 Lesson 10	Grammar: ~아/어 있다 The pattern ~아/어 있다 is added to intransitive verb stems to indicate that the action is currently taking place
Week 4 Lesson 11	Grammar: ~아지다/어지다 The pattern ~아지다/어지다 is added to adjective stems to indicate a change of state or condition has occurred
Week 5 Lesson 11	Grammar: ~네요 The pattern ~네요 is added to verb or adjective stems to show that one is surprised or impressed
Week 6 Lesson 12	Grammar: ~어/아 주실래요?

	The pattern ~어/아 주실래요? is added to verb stems to indicate a request made by the speaker
Week 7 Lesson 12	Grammar: ~는데/(으)ㄴ데 The pattern ~는데/(으)ㄴ데 is added to verb or adjective stems to provide some background information or context for the clause that follows it
Week 8 Lesson 13	Grammar: ~았으면/었으면 좋겠다 1) The pattern ~았으면/었으면 좋겠다 is added to verb or adjective stems to express a wish or desire
Week 9 Lesson 13	Grammar: ~거나 The pattern ~거나 is added to verb or adjective stems to indicate that one may select and choose either the former or the latter
Week 10 Lesson 14	Grammar: ~기 때문에 The pattern ~기 때문에 is added to verb or adjective stems to express reason or cause
Week 11 Lesson 14	Grammar: ~겠~ The pattern ~겠~ is added to verb or adjective stems to express conjecture or politeness
Week 12 Review	Review (L10-L14)
